Magical Realism: a style of writing that blends a realistic setting with fantastical or supernatural elements. These magical elements are treated as normal by the characters and narrator, not as an interruption to the real world.

Poetry: literary work in which special intensity is given to the expression of feelings and ideas by the use of distinctive style and rhythm; poems collectively or as a genre of literature.

Narrative Nonfiction: a literary genre that tells true stories using the techniques and styles of fiction, blending factual information with compelling storytelling. It's often referred to as creative nonfiction or literary nonfiction.

Essay Collection: a book or anthology containing a group of essays, often united by a theme or subject. These essays are typically non-fiction, focusing on the writer's thoughts, experiences, or perspectives on a given subject.

Thriller: characterized by heightened feelings of suspense, excitement, and anxiety. It's often plot-driven, known for their intense pace and focus on the emotional and psychological impact of a story.

Romantasy: a genre that blends fantasy and romance, where both elements are equally important and drive the narrative. It's characterized by a focus on passionate love stories set in magical or fantastical worlds.

Nordic Noir: crime fiction usually written from a police point of view and set in Scandinavia or the Nordic countries. Nordic noir often employs plain language, avoiding metaphor, and is typically set in bleak landscapes.

Travel Literature: The genre of travel literature or travelogue encompasses outdoor literature, guide books, nature writing, and travel memoirs.

Epistolary Text: a narrative form that is predominantly composed of letters and diary entries, but can also include other documents like emails, transcripts, and even newspaper articles.
